Precautionary Statements

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give

artificial respiration. Get medical attention.

Skin contact: Immediately wash skin thoroughly with soap and water. Remove contaminated

clothing and footwear. Wash clothing before reuse. If symptoms develop and

persist, get medical attention.

Eye contact: Flush with copious amounts of water, preferably, lukewarm water for at least

15 minutes, holding eyelids open all the time. Get medical attention.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

pressure that could result in violent rupture of sealed storage vessels or

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Use personal protection recommended in Section 8, isolate the hazard area and deny entry to unnecessary and unprotected personnel.

Environmental precautions: Do not allow product to enter sewer or waterways. Ventilate area.

Clean-up methods: Remove all sources of ignition. Ensure adequate ventilation. Soak up with
